Terms range from 1 to 3 years and are staggered so that no more than half of the National Board are being replaced or re-elected in any given year. Members may serve a maximum of two consecutive 3 year terms.

Induction and training is provided to ensure Board Members are comfortable and knowledgeable in their role: previous board experience is an asset but not required.
